Postgraduate routes

SCITT

School Direct

A school based course led by group of schools who work together to provide teacher training. The schools have undergone an accreditation process to become a provider of ITT. A school based course led by a group of schools working with an HEI or SCITT to provide teacher training.

The salaried route is usually for candidates who can demonstrate significant school experience and who can take over classes without a teacher present from day 1.



Similarities (HEI, SCITT, SD)

- Find course via DfE Publish
- Apply through UCAS Teacher Training
- All lead to Qualified Teacher Status (but not all lead to PGCE)
- One year course (except part time SD salaried)
- DfE bursaries available depending on course



Teacher Training Overview

Some of the main elements of teacher training are:

- Interviews
- Taught programme
- Placements (Two contrasting schools)
- Visits to you on placement
- QTS Assessment
- PGCE Masters level assignments
- Making recommendations for QTS
