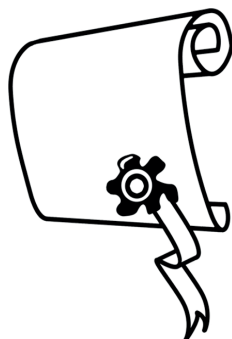

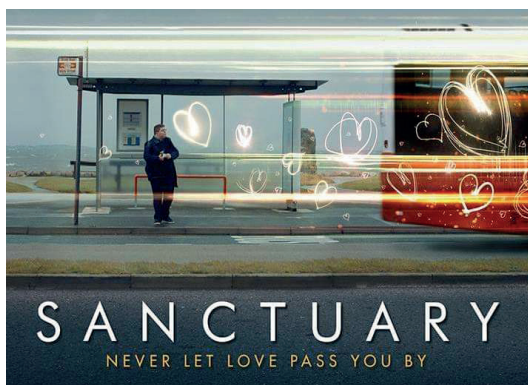

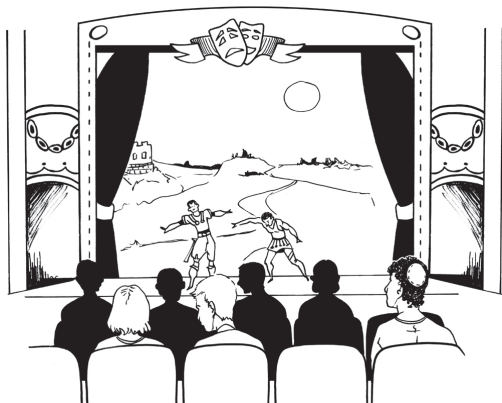
At this event, we will show a movie called Sanctuary. This story in this movie takes place in Galway, in the Republic of Ireland.

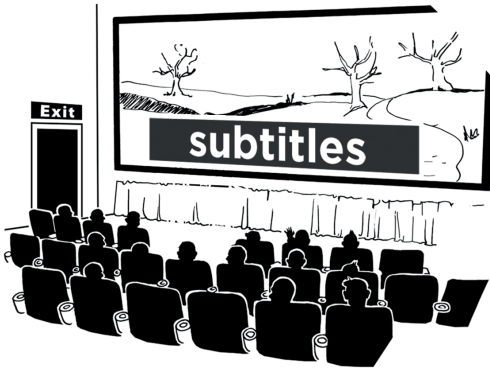
